

June 26, 2019 Meeting Minutes 10:00-11:30 a.m. Anderson Hospital, Maryville, IL

Janice Rushing, Vice Chair, began the meeting with a welcome to all and asked for brief introductions from participants. There were 49 people in attendance.

Current Business:

- The Executive Committee welcomes two open at large members: Julie Swanston and Angela Roberts.
- Karen shared that Chestnut has Narcan available and people are needed to disseminate and train community members. If you know anyone who might be interested, please contact Karen at killashalski@chestnut.org. Karen provided a handout about Narcan Training, Administration and Distribution Summary.
- Toni Randall read her Facebook post about her son, Elijah who passed away in May 2019. The post is a reminder about the importance of the people in our communities who are living with addiction.

Guest speaker:

- Judge Kyle Anne Knapp, Madison County Drug Court provided an overview of Drug Court.
 - \circ $\,$ Madison County Drug Court started in 1996 and was the first one in Illinois.
 - 31,000 drug courts are in existence today across the United States and 136,000 people are part of the drug courts annually
 - Madison County also has Veterans Court and Mental Health Court
 - Drug Court cost the County \$4000.00 per person and prison costs the State of Illinois \$22,000 per year.
 - Client must voluntarily accept Drug Court with all of the guidelines in place; clients must meet all required milestones to move through each of the five phases which takes 14 months to complete; Tuesday and Thursday are Drug Court days with 75 people currently in Drug Court; each person is assessed for the most appropriate path of treatment
 - Graduation is held two times per year; average of five babies are born every year; 98% complete Drug Court with GED or high school degree; 85% of clients participate in medically assisted treatment; 100% of clients graduate with a job
 - Homelessness is a problem for people in Drug Court; a halfway house would be a great help to clients.
